You're proud to be a Sunflower Pirate and you'll do what you can to help out, but you can't stay here. Tira is still worried about her mom, so you need to continue. Antonio, who looks like he feels better, says that your next destination is the Bonsai Garden, so you say goodbye to Solidaster and set sail again...

You land on the coast and walk to a tiny forest. Most of the trees are no taller than a meter, yet they look very old and strong. You walk around the forest toward the biggest tree; it's about two meters tall and looks very old. You see some kind of fruit on its branches, so you go to pick one when the tree suddenly shakes and bellows:

"Don't touch my fruit! My name is Grapple. I am the guardian of the Bonsai Garden. These ancient trees are the picking grounds of the Mantis Monks. They swim here once a year as a test of will and their reward are the fruits here.

It is a great honor to feed them, but I'm afraid this year we may not make it. We need to collect a ½ kg of fruit, but I'm not sure how much we've collected so far. If you help me figure this out, I will give you something good..."

Task: Grapple needs your help. There are three types of fruits in the Bonsai Garden: Bananas, Oranges, and Pineapples. Each one weighs a certain number of grams. The boxes with numbers total the weights of the fruits: If it's on the right, it's the sum of the fruit in that row. If it's on the bottom, it is the sum of the fruit in that column. You need to:

- 1) Figure out the missing totals for the remaining rows and columns.
- 2) Add up all the totals for each row and column, then figure out how many grams of fruit they still need to make. [Remember, they need to produce a $\frac{1}{2}$ kg to succeed.]
